He was born in 1967. He graduated from the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Zagreb (Medical study in Split). He completed his specialist internship in psychiatry at the "Sisters of Mercy" Clinical

Hospital in Zagreb. During his specialization, he completed an introductory course in group psychoanalysis (Clinic for Psychological Medicine, KBC Zagreb). He attended the scientific post-graduate study "Medical care and public health" at the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Mostar. He defended his master's thesis (2011) and doctoral dissertation (2013) at the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Mostar. He also completed education on the treatment of addiction diseases in Zagreb (State Center for the Treatment of Addiction, 1999) and Italy (Servizio Prevention and Tossicodipedenze Parma, 1998). He is the current head of the Center for Mental Health in the Mostar Health Center, and was also employed at the Center for the Prevention and Outpatient Treatment of Addiction in Mostar. He is a member Board of the Association of Psychiatrists in Bosnia and Herzegovina, vice president of the Association of alcoholics and experts for other addictions in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Awarded for the best scientific paper by the Croatian Society for Alcoholism and Other Addictions (2004) and the Croatian Psychiatric Society (2006). He is a member of the Editorial Board of the international journal Alcoholism (since 2019 Archives of Psychiatry Research: An International Journal of Psychiatry and Related Sciences), editorin-chief of the journal Annals of Biomedical and Clinical Research. He is a longterm member of the Organizing Committee of the Mostar Psychiatry Saturday



Symposium, and was also on the Organizing Committee of the Croatian Conference on Alcoholism and Other Addictions, and the Alpe-Adria Conference on Alcoholism. He participated as a researcher on a project of the Federal Ministry of Science.
